1.If anything was possible, what would your dream job be, and why?

If anything is possible, my dream job would be a painter or an artist who travels around the world and gets inspiration from the places I visit. Painting is one of the ways I express myself. I don't talk that much but only when it is urgent or necessary. I find myself more expressive if I'm doing something art-related. I would feel fulfilled and contented if I could do what I love and at the same time express myself through it. Aside from that, I want to see the world through a closer lens, that's why I want to visit each country and paint the most salient part of it. Also, I love how unique each country and its culture are. One of the things I want to do is to immerse myself in their cultures and learn their traditions. In that way, I can paint more subjects and connect them to their heritage.

2. Have you ever experienced a stressful situation in your past workplace (college if fresh graduate), what was it and how did you overcome it?

I encountered a stressful situation during college and after that experience, I learned a lot from it. During my 3rd year of college, I was elected as the class mayor. I had a lot of responsibilities back then because the institution and the students were still adjusting to the new norm of learning. My tasks usually include compiling the modules of my classmates and sending them to the professor. However, most of my classmates are working and would send their modules later than the deadline. At the end of the internship period, my critic teacher said that I can be trusted with most of the tasks in school.

I think it is also an accomplishment that I am firm about setting up boundaries. I am also proud of myself that I can remain calm whenever I encounter a problem. I've gone through a lot during college, and it changed me into something better and stronger.
