1.If anything was possible, what would your dream job be, and why?

My dream job would be a Police Officer. It's been my dream ever since high school. I was so sure that it would be my profession at that time. I'm just fascinated by how cool they look in their uniform. Also seeing a woman in a Police uniform is just amazing. 2. Have you ever experienced a stressful situation in your past workplace (college if fresh graduate), what was it and how did you overcome it?

It was when I had to transfer from one branch to another. It was not easy for me at first. I had to start all over again. There are a lot of adjustments on my part that includes my duties and my working environment. But on the positive side, I'm grateful for every opportunity given to me may it be small or big.
