

1.If anything was possible, what would your dream job be, and why?

This is a common problem in my past workplace and as I do my job longer, I am able to not repeat my past mistakes and ensure that I check the quality and accuracy of the actual work as per the construction drawings.

I actually learn a lot of things doing designs because as we go along, the Architect will guide us on how is a material installed properly and what is its purpose and we reflect it in doing our 3d models.
