1.If anything was possible, what would your dream job be, and why?

My dream job is to become a doctor. It was a dream that I never get to reach since I came from a poor family. I am also the eldest so I can't afford eight years or more just to study, instead I pursued a degree that only requires four years to study. My mother was a nurse so I was very interested in being in the medical field ever since I was young. I am very passionate about taking care of my family members whenever they are sick. At a very young age, I am knowledgeable of different kinds of diseases and how to treat some of them. My mom entrusted me with getting her blood pressure and I am very happy every time I do it because it makes me feel that I am in the medical field. If anything is truly possible, I would pursue medicine to learn a lot about the human body and how to take care of it.

2. Have you ever experienced a stressful situation in your past workplace (college if fresh graduate), what was it and how did you overcome it?

The stressful situation that I faced when I was in college was during thesis. We were six people in a thesis group. Our thesis is about an electronic census application that can be used in our country. It is an app that can be downloaded into mobile phones and to be fill-out personally. We created this thesis during the pandemic time. It was hard to gather the group during the pandemic, let alone conduct an online meeting because other members have trouble in accessing a good internet connection in their homes. Other than it was troublesome to gather the members, it was also hard to get them their assigned tasks. Most of the time it was just the three of us struggling to finish the paper and the others can't be found. Though it was hard, I pushed through in finishing all the documents, individually messaging every member to make sure they at least do something to help the group. In the end, the thesis paper that we sent has little to nothing mistakes and we submitted on time. All of us in the group have graduated together.

3. In your previous position, what task did you find most challenging and why? What task did you enjoy most and why?

day, I remained on my faith.
