Also, my main role in this is to update the client, follow up with fabricators on the progress, and confirm every detail so the workflow of the project will be smooth.

The task that I find the most challenging in my previous position is the written admin task. Since we have a limited data entry system in our office, we are most likely to manually encode and edit tools for everything. I have other pending for that day but sometimes I'm unable to finish it because I will consume so much time just writing and manually editing and encoding the job orders and collection of the day. The task that I enjoyed the most was when a client decided to choose us for their signage services from the beginning of the project until payment was made. The all in all process of the project from the client's inquiry, details for the graphics and measurement of the signage, approval for fabrication, preparation for the installation, up until making the billing or invoices of the project to the collection of the payment. Also, by these tasks I was able to build relationships with my clients and co-workers.
