We inform them about it, some understand but some just lash out at us out of frustration, the stressful thing for us agents are the fact that we can't be angry at them for not understanding the situation. During these situations, I usually calm myself first before going to the counter. I also try to be more understanding of the passengers. I calmly



explain to them the reason for the cancellation and give them alternative ways of what to do with their tickets.

3. In your previous position, what task did you find most challenging and why? What task did you enjoy most and why?

In my previous job, I was assigned to the CLC (Centralized Load Control) role, this role is very crucial for the operation because the agent who will be assigned to this role will be the one to monitor the flights, to connect with other stations especially Manila and Cebu stations. Being a CLC agent, you need to be alert and ready to accept the details of the flight from the ramp agent. After getting all the details from the ramp agent, I will input it into the system so that other stations will know the status of the flight. The task I enjoyed the most was the checking in of passengers and being assigned to the boarding gate, where I will be boarding passengers on their respective flights. I also love the "Manifest" role, wherein my only task is to wait for the close counter of the flight and print the details or manifest of the flight and give the documents to the ramp agent.

My previous manager said before that I am good at my job and that is the reason why I was assigned to a different department after 6 months of being assigned at the check in counter. My supervisor also told me that I am focused on my job, that whenever I am being assigned to do something, I tend to do it seriously.
